## *Pastoral Ponderings*

A pastor from another church recently shared an insight into Emmanuel with me. He said that a few years before I arrived here, he read a letter about Emmanuel which was produced by lay leaders. Perhaps it was a fund-raising letter. Perhaps it was part of a newsletter. I don't know the occasion. What struck this pastor was that the letter was written by regular church members, not Emmanuel's pastor at the time. He said that many of the statements made about Emmanuel might also have been truthfully said about his own church, but that the lay people in his congregation would never have done so because that was the pastor's job. His observation was that faithful lay leadership and ownership of our shared ministry has been one of Emmanuel's strengths for a long time. I would agree.



I am grateful for many aspects of our community life. In the spirit of Thanksgiving, let me express some appreciation.

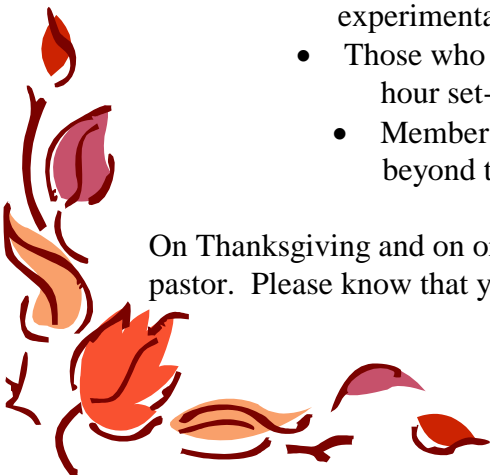
Thank you to:

### **FOCUS Interfaith Food Pantry Looks at New Model**

Inspired by the work of Robert Lupton (*Toxic Charity*) in the Atlanta area, FOCUS is exploring an alternative model to food pantries for addressing food security issues. It is built around collaborative groups of low income households who meet and manage the food distribution program. Each household pays a small fee at each meeting. The goals include community development and promotion of dignity and ownership for the participants. This would not replace the Pantry, but provide another means of meeting part of family food needs in a specific geographical area in our neighborhood.
