Pastoral Ponderings



Evangelism for organizing our presence at Pride, and thanks to everyone who volunteered at our booth or marched in the parade. If you missed it last year, talk to Ruth Pushee about being involved this June.

On Easter Sunday, one new family worshipped with us for the first time. In conversation at the Easter Reception, I learned that they had previously attended an evening concert at EBC and had visited our booth at the Pride festival. Those two encounters were so positive that they chose to celebrate Easter with us. They thanked me for our witness at Pride, but they noted that other churches were also present there. What set Emmanuel apart, they said, was the sense of confidence in our church expressed by those at the Pride booth. Kudos to Michael and the concert crew, kudos to Membership and

This conversation was a strong affirmation of Emmanuel. To say that we have confidence is not to say that we are arrogant or boastful about our congregation. It is to say that we have purpose and mission, that we are engaged in practicing our faith, and that others can readily see that.

As I have listened to you for the last few years, I have come to believe that there was a time when you did not have this confidence. There was a time when you came to believe that the money would run out, the human energy would run out, and our church would cease to exist. That belief laid a foundation for many of your decisions. You tended to make decisions in the direction of conserving resources to extend life as long as possible. Hearing these newcomers' remark on your confidence was a signal to me that you no longer believe that. Instead, you believe that you have a future. That is a wonderful shift.

I firmly believe that Emmanuel does have a future. That future will arrive as we are living out the mission and purpose to which God has called us. In the coming weeks, we will be hearing recommendations from the Finance Summit and the Capital Campaign Committee. These recommendations will be about allocating resources and exercising stewardship for the present and future of our congregation. As we receive those recommendations and make congregational decisions, I hope that you will join me in leaning into the word of the Lord as it came to the people of Judah through the prophet Jeremiah:

*"For I know the plans I have for you, says the LORD,
plans for welfare and not for evil, to give you a future and a hope."*



Over the course of the year, we receive five special offerings which are distributed through American Baptist Churches/USA and/or the American Baptist Churches of New York State. With two of the five done for 2015, here is where we stand:



Retired Missionaries and Ministers -- This offering goes to provide emergency support and thank you checks to persons who served in professional ministry during their working years. Emmanuel gave **\$590** to this offering in January 2015, compared with **\$511** in 2014.

America For Christ -- Monies collected support a wide variety of personnel and projects in the United States and Puerto Rico, including neighborhood action programs, chaplaincy programs, partnerships with American Baptist colleges and seminaries and refugee resettlement initiatives. Twenty-nine percent of our gifts are returned to the New York region for ministry. Emmanuel gave **\$656** to this offering in March 2015, compared with **\$637** in 2014.

Thank for your generosity. The next special offering will be **One Great Hour of Sharing** to be received in June. Look for more information in the June *Mosaic*. In the meantime, keep in mind that one way to support relief efforts after the devastating earthquake in Nepal is through the One Great Hour of Sharing offering. All gifts designed for Nepal will be distributed through our mission partners in that region. Gifts may be made at any time. Designate it for One Great Hour of Sharing and for Nepal, if you so desire.


