Pastoral Ponderings



Thank you to each person who took the time to complete a pastoral ministry survey last month. I value your input and sincerely appreciate your efforts in providing critical and thoughtful comments. The results have been compiled. The Pastoral Relations Committee and I will discuss them at our next meeting. Information relevant to particular commissions will be shared with them.

As a group, you offered the most feedback in the section on hospitality. Those questions were about how we reach out to first-time guests and visitors and how we assimilate newcomers into the life of the congregation. I am delighted that you see this as a priority. To answer one question that was asked a few times, I follow up with every newcomer in worship if they provide a way to do so. We try to make sure every newcomer receives a welcome packet with a contact information card. If they turn in a card, I send an e-mail or a handwritten note within the week after they attended worship. If they don't provide a way to contact them, I respect their privacy and hope that they will choose to provide that information at a future time. One way that you can help this process is to make sure that newcomers receive those welcome packets. The welcome packet comes with a pen that has Emmanuel's name on it. Make sure you let them know they can keep the pen!

We cannot follow up on newcomers, unless we have newcomers. More people come to church because of a personal invitation than for any other reason. If you haven't invited someone to church in 2015, set a goal to do so before the year ends. There are several opportunities to do that between now and Christmas Eve. Throw your regular preacher under the bus and invite someone to hear special guest preacher Rev. Peter Carman on November 8. Consider a non-worship event like the potluck on November 21. Or invite someone to share the First Sunday of Advent with worship and a family-friendly service project of packing cookie bags on November 29.

Before Advent begins, we will make available a film clip setting the mood for the season at EBC. You can share it with friends via e-mail and Facebook. One very special not-to-be-missed opportunity for inviting purposes is the series of Wednesday evening Advent services called Breathing Space. Those will be on Wednesday evenings, December 2, 9 and 16 at 6:00. Watch for more details coming soon.
