If someone made me choose a favorite season, it would not be summer. I appreciate different things about every season and I especially enjoy living in a part of the world with four different seasons. If someone made me choose just one as a favorite, I would choose autumn, with its crisp days and changing leaves and apple-picking. But I am also learning the value of living in the now, and even though the calendar and the iris blooming in my yard say that it is spring, it certainly feels like summer.

I am excited about this summer. I have planned to travel more than I have in recent years. There's trip this month to California for a ceremony to mark the end of Molly's residency and to celebrate a thirty-fifth wedding anniversary for Jim and me. In July, we'll go to Kentucky to honor Jim's parents on their 80<sup>th</sup> birthdays. In late August, Jim and my brother and I are accompanying my father on a Rhine River cruise. I recently learned that this river cruise has been on my 87-year-old father's bucket list for about 30 years.

At the beginning of August, I will be at Central Seminary in Kansas City, participating in Conflict Transformation Training with Dan and Sharon Buttry. 

In his book, *White Too Long: The Legacy of White Supremacy in American Christianity*, life-long Baptist Robert P Jones draws on history, public opinion surveys and personal experience to argue that American churches have been thoroughly structured by an interest in protecting white supremacy. One of his provocative findings is that “the more racist attitudes a person holds, the more likely he or she is to identify as a white Christian.”


