November begins with the celebrations of All Saints and All Souls. We do not always attend to these festivals as carefully as our more liturgical siblings, but they still resonate. These celebrations recognize the powerful spiritual bond between the living and the departed. We may refer to this as the communion of the saints or employ the image of the great cloud of witnesses from Hebrews 12. Those who came before us shaped us by the decisions they made, the doctrine they taught, and the institutions they left behind.


One of the easiest ways to commune with a departed saint is to read something they wrote. I am often blessed by the poetry of John O'Donohue. He was a Catholic priest in Western Ireland for 21 years until he left the priesthood in 2000. He was also a best-selling author and speaker and environmental activist. In response to the yearning that November evokes in me, and possibly in you too, I share this poem.






## November Texts and Themes

As one church year ends and another begins, we hear the final readings from the Year C lectionary cycle. November brings a recognition of All Saints Sunday and the Reign of Christ and the beginning of Advent.

November 6	Luke 20:27-38	All Saints Sunday
November 13	Luke 21:5-19	
November 20	Jeremiah 23:1-6 Colossians 1:11-20	Reign of Christ
November 27	Matthew 1:1-17 Isaiah 2:1-5	First Sunday of Advent

Our 2022 Advent theme comes from Mary's song of protest and praise. Despite the challenges and vulnerability she faced, Mary could glimpse the scale and scope of the good news she was part of bringing forth. This good news transcends time and space—it was and is bigger than just her. Christ is coming for collective liberation: God's redemption is at work for years to come. Therefore, the promise is meant to be lived out and passed on from one generation to the next. *From Generation to Generation...* reminds us of the ways our lives, histories, actions, and stories are interconnected and woven together.
